SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS

All races will start off the Town Park at the foot of Ocean Street between a club buoy marked "X" and the mast of the Committee Boat (anchored).

The finish line for all races will be established between the designated mark and the mast on the Committee Boat (anchored). This line will be as near as possible at right angle to the last mark of the course.

The Race Committee reserves the right to change the course after the start at any mark of the course, and to establish the finish line in its absolute discretion.

The Committee Boat when anchored will hoist a black ball.

Courses will be announced by the International Code Flag flown from the Starbord yardarm of the Committee Boat, designating the course marked on the chart.

STARTING SIGNALS

There will be a five-minute interval between signals.

The actual signal will be the hoisting or dropping of a cylinder; but this will be accompanied by a sound signal whenever possible.

Sound signals are not to be relied upon (watch the red cylinder).

Due to harbor conditions, Rule No. regarding the proper passing of channel markers, will be disregarded.

There shall be a time limit of 21/2 hours on finish of first boat.
