- ✓ Rules The Rules of the North American Yacht Racing Union govern unless otherwise provided.
- ✓ Entries A yacht crossing the starting line with its class will be regarded as entering if its racing number is displayed. If enough boats are entered in any class, divisions will be made according to number. Announcement will be made from the Committee Boat, at time schedule is given out.
- ~~Prizes~~ ~~A first and second prize for each class having two or more starters (and each division of each class).~~
- ✓ Tide At Hyannis Harbor, Tuesday, July 25, 1939--High water, 8:15 A.M., Low water, 2:10 P.M. *At Hy. Harbor + .20 min of Hyport.*
- ✓ Signals Code Flag Q--Course sailed in reverse
 " " G--Postponement for 15 minutes
 " " H--Race is off
 " " L--Race will finish at Mark ---
 " " M--Course is shortened
 " " O--Omit next mark
leave turning marks to starboard port
- ✓ Start and Finish Races will start off the Town Park at the foot of Ocean Street between a Club buoy marked X and the mast of the Committee Boat (anchored). The finish line for all races will be established between the designated mark and the mast of the Committee Boat (anchored).
- ✓ Starting Signals Warning signal--Hoist one red and one yellow cylinder. Preparatory signal--Dropping of yellow cylinder. Starting signal--Dropping of red cylinder. All accompanied by a sound signal whenever possible. There will be a five minute interval between signals.
- ✓ Committee Boats When at the finish line, the Committee Boat will display a red cylinder.
- ✓ Note All times in this circular are Daylight Saving.

Keep to east of zone SPECIAL NOTICE *W. Park*

For Course J. Leave marks as follows:-- From starting line leave mark U to starboard; E to port; Z to starboard; and U to port. Finish on line between committee boat (anchored) and Club Buoy X.

Do not pass to west of zone buoy off the Point

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- ~~Warning Signals~~ ~~Tuesday, July 25, 1939~~
- ~~Starting Signals~~ ~~Schedule sheet available at 1 P.M. on the Committee Boat.~~
- ✓ Indication of Courses Courses will be announced by the International Code flag flown from the starboard yard arm of the Committee Boat, designating the course marked on the chart.
- ✓ Rounds of Courses Courses shall be sailed around once unless the Repeater Flag is flown.
- ✓ Leaving a Single Outer Marker On a course having only one outer TURNING MARK, leave that mark to STARBOARD unless Committee Boat says otherwise.
- Channel Markers On ALL courses N.Y.R.A. rule as to leaving channel marks on proper side may be disregarded. *Refer to N.Y. 28*
except when sailing inside courses
- ✓ Restricted Area Marked by white flags. Yachts shall keep out of this area until their preparatory signal is made.
- Time Limit A race in any class in which no yacht has finished by 6 P.M. shall be declared off and may be resailed at a time designated by the Race Committee. *5.30*
- ✓ Yacht not Finishing When a yacht does not finish or finishes after the Committee Boat has left the line, the Captain or his representative shall report its return as soon as possible to the Race Committee at the line or ashore.
- ✓ Owner not on Board If the owner is not on board, the Race Committee must be notified before the Warning Signal who the owner's representative is to be. The latter shall be a member in good standing of the club in which the yacht is enrolled.
- Protests The provisions of Rule XLV are to be followed. In addition, it is requested that the incident be reported to the Race Committee ashore directly after the race.
