

Scudder Is Double Beetle Winner

Lockhart Races Snafu to 1st Place for Castonguay Trophy

HYANNIS, July 7—Charles F. "Chuck" Lockhart, vice-commodore of the Hyannis Yacht Club, raced Hudson Baxter's Knockabout, Snafu, to a first place finish in the A. Harold Castonguay Trophy Race in Lewis Bay. In other racing action, Robert Scudder engineered his boat across the finish line first in the two Beetlecat divisions.

Lockhart's boat covered the course in a near record time of 1:56.30, six seconds ahead of second place finisher F. Fenner. Also in the boat with veteran skipper Lockhart, acting as crew, were Ginny Smith and Bill Zschau.

In the Beetle Class there were two divisions and Scudder won both races. A special pirate race was run for boats of all classes, won by Jon Baxter.
